Lesson	Lesson 3 – Selecting suitable colours and backgrounds

Context of the lesson Where this fits into the "Big Picture"	In this unit, pupils will plan and create presentations about endangered animals. Pupils will explore the concept of 'fitness for purpose' when using images, text, colour and sound to enhance their presentation. They will consider how to match and adapt their presentation to a given audience and purpose. Finally, they will evaluate the suitability of their work for different audiences and purposes.

input/Activities. What the pupils should undertake with approximate timings.	Starter Whilst students are arriving hand out a copy of 'lesson3 starter.doc' either to individual students or to pairs. Students should work quietly through the starter activity whilst you are taking the register. Go through the answers with the class.	5 mins	
	<i>Teacher led discussion: Using different colours and text in a presentation</i> Show students 'presentation 3'. Ask them just to watch, not to make any comments, but to think about what they are seeing. Show students 'presentation 4', going through one slide at a time, and	10 mins	
	discussing what is wrong with each slide.		
	 Lead a whole-class discussion about the effectiveness of the presentation. Discuss why colour is used in a presentation, for example, to attract the attention of the audience, to highlight key points, to illustrate, to make it more interesting. Ask pupils to consider what size the text needs to be so that the audience can read if from where they are viewing. 		
	 Explain that the amount of text maybe limited, because of the slide size and for clarity Explain that it is important not to have too many slides, to avoid losing the audience's interest. Explain the difference between serif and sans serif fonts and reach an agreement on which is the easiest to read on a screen. 		
	<i>Individual activity: Developing the presentation through fonts and colour</i> Students should open their presentation.	10 mins

	Show students 'presentation 5'. Ask them just to watch, not to make any comments, but to think about what they are seeing.	
	Show students the presentation again going through one slide at a time, and discussing what is wrong with the backgrounds that have been chosen.
